The aims of the course are to:

- Develop teachers' knowledge of pupils' cognitive and linguistic development within a multilingual context
- Enhance teachers' awareness, understanding of and ability to reflect on issues of race, culture, class and gender and their impact on educational achievement
- Demonstrate good practice, partnership teaching, and inclusive strategies in the classroom in line with OfSTED recommendations
- Empower teachers to influence whole school policies and practice from an informed perspective, affecting whole school change

Course Content

The course aims to cover all aspects of Ethnic Minority Achievement with particular focus on:

- * **Roles and Responsibilities within the school**
- * **Focus on the Classroom and Language**
- * **Focus on Specific Groups**
- * **Focus on Families and Communities**
- * **Focus on the Needs of Individual Learners**
- * **Focus on Whole School Responsibilities**

• Who is the course for?

This is a cross-phase course for all qualified teachers and graduates working with young people

• How is it structured?

The course will be taught for half a day per week (2-5 pm) in term time for one year . It will consist of centrally held sessions, workshops, seminars, discussion groups etc. as well as flexible tutorial guidance.

• Where will it be held?

The centrally taught part of the course will be at Laycock Street, Islington N1 1TH (very close to Highbury and Islington tube station).

* When will it start?

The next course will start September 2010.

• How will it be assessed?

Assessment will take the form of :

- * *An analytical assignment drawing on a personal learning journal, linking professional practice and theory.*
- * *A reflective analysis of a filmed micro teaching session*
- * *A three point action plan and evaluation for implementing whole school change.*
